


You created light out of darkness and brought forth life on the earth.


In his dying and rising, you gave birth to your church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.


DWARP Update



Dismantling Racism and White Privilege Committee (DRAWP) of the Presbytery of Giddings Lovejov hosted a gathering at WGPC on December 9 to share what our congregations in the presbytery are doing to address the Matthew 25 precepts of congregational vitality, racial justice, and the elimination of poverty. An inspiring presentation was made by Rev. Dr. Jessica Williams of the Kairos Center. and each of the eleven churches represented shared how they are supporting these precepts in work ranging from scholarships to educate young Kenyan students to partnerships with many local organizations to address community needs. DRAWP provides opportunities to make friends while identifying and redressing harms done to the predominantly African American churches within our presbytery. events are being planned. We give thanksgiving for this opportunity and our foundational faith that makes all things possible in Christ Jesus.
