Update from the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee

The Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC) has worked faithfully for 18 months toward calling an Associate Pastor for Faith and Family while encountering multiple challenges. Following the established PC(USA) process, we have found very few candidates whose qualifications and interests align with our congregation's needs. It's time for a new approach.

With approval from Session, the APNC has engaged a non-profit organization called PneuMatrix, which specializes in assisting churches through transitions, including minister search/sourcing. Having spoken with numerous references who have successfully called clergy with the help of PneuMatrix, the committee is quite optimistic about their process and how it can effectively advance our efforts! You can read more about them at chechurches.org/the-changing-church.

PneuMatrix will:

- Send a dedicated consultant to meet in person with the APNC to crystalize the most critical skills and attributes desired in our next Associate Pastor;
- Use its deep networks around the denomination to identify candidates who meet our qualifications (whether actively seeking a call or not);
- Fully vet those candidates (qualifications, willingness to move to St. Louis, references); and
- Present a pool of well-vetted candidates to the APNC

The APNC will then:

- Review applications/materials/sermons;
- · Conduct multiple in-depth interviews; and
- Prayerfully complete our process.

The engagement cost with PneuMatrix is being funded from the legacy gift of Dorothy Meyer that was specifically set aside for special projects of the Session.

The APNC asks for your continued prayers and patience as we enter this focused and exciting phase of the search process.


