SCRIPTURE READING

1 Samuel 1:1-18

Pew Bible pgs. 244-245

- L: Hear now the word of God . . .
 - ¹There was a man named Elkanah ² He had two wives named Hannah and Peninnah. Peninnah had children, but Hannah had no children.
 - ³ Now this man used to go up year by year from his town to worship and to sacrifice to the Lord at Shiloh. ⁴ On the day when Elkanah sacrificed, he would give portions to his wife Peninnah and to all her children; ⁵ but to Hannah he gave a double portion, because he loved her, though the Lord had closed her womb. ⁶ Her rival used to provoke her severely, to irritate her. ⁷ So it went on year by year; as often as she went up to the house of the Lord, she used to provoke her. Therefore Hannah wept and would not eat. ⁸ Her husband said to her, "Hannah, why is your heart sad? Am I not more to you than ten sons?"
 - ⁹ After they had eaten at Shiloh, Hannah rose and presented herself before the Lord. Now Eli the priest was sitting on the seat beside the doorpost of the temple. ¹⁰ She was deeply distressed and prayed to the Lord, and wept bitterly. ¹¹ She made this vow: "O Lord of hosts, if only you will look on the misery of your servant, and remember me, and not forget your servant, but will give to your servant a male child, then I will set him before you as a nazirite until the day of his death."
 - ¹² As she continued praying before the Lord, Eli observed her mouth. ¹³ Hannah was praying silently; only her lips moved, but her voice was not heard; therefore Eli thought she was drunk. ¹⁴ So Eli said to her, "How long will you make a drunken spectacle of yourself? Put away your wine." ¹⁵ But Hannah answered, "No, my lord, I am a woman deeply troubled; I have drunk neither wine nor strong drink, but I have been pouring out my soul before the Lord. ¹⁶ Do not regard your servant as a worthless woman, for I have been speaking out of my great anxiety and vexation all this time." ¹⁷ Then Eli answered, "Go in peace; the God of Israel grant the petition you have made to him." ¹⁸ And she said, "Let your servant find favor in your sight."

Then the woman went to her quarters, ate and drank with her husband, and her countenance was sad no longer.

100% Limit on Eligible Cash Contributions Made by Taxpayers Who Itemize in 2021

Taxpayers who itemize can generally claim a deduction for charitable contributions to qualifying organizations. The deduction is typically limited to 20% to 60% of their adjusted gross income and varies depending on the type of contribution and the type of charity. The law now allows taxpayers to apply up to 100% of their AGI, for calendar-year 2021 qualified contributions. Qualified contributions are cash contributions to qualifying charitable organizations. The 100% limit is not automatic; the taxpaver must choose to take the new limit for any qualified cash contribution. Otherwise, the usual limit applies. The taxpayer's other allowed charitable contribution deductions reduce the maximum amount allowed under this election. 
"Stress and Resilience in a Pandemic World" Sunday, November 21, 10:50-11:45 a.m. in the Church Parlor and on Zoom
