

**Afghan Family Update**  
**January 21, 2022**

Wow! It's been quite a week. We are incredibly thankful and encouraged by the response to the Sign Up Genius for items needed for our family. As always, Webster Pres steps up when needed! Please continue to check the Sign Up Genius as we will be adding items as those things needed are brought to our attention.

To keep you up to date, here's what this week has held. We took our entire family to Target on Monday morning and all the family members picked out new shoes. Additionally, the children each received a couple of items of clothing and thus, we were able to ascertain sizes so that we can share them with you. The funds to purchase these items came from The Mission Commission.

The sizes are as follows:

Girl – Age 11 – Size 5 Shoes and Size Large in Girls Pants and tops

Boy – Age 10 – Size 5 Shoes and Size 8 in Pants, 8-10 (Medium) in tops, and 6-8 in underwear

Boy – Age 9 – Size 3 Shoes and Size 8 in Pants, 8-10 (Medium) in tops, and 6-8 in underwear

Boy – Age 5 – Size 2 Shoes and Size 6 in Pants, Size 6-7 Small in tops, and 6-8 in Underwear

Boy – Age 4 – Size 13 in Little Boys Shoes, Size 5 in Pants, Size 4-5 (XS) in tops, Size 4-5 in Underwear

Girl – Age 2 – Size 7 in Little Girls Shoes, Size 3T in all other clothes.

The family would certainly appreciate gently used clothing that is in good condition but we ask that you donate only the sizes that we have listed. Space is at a premium in their home and there isn't room for them to store clothing in sizes that they cannot wear yet. Please keep that in mind while bringing clothes to church. Additionally, we will have the family members choose what they would like to keep and the rest of the items will be donated to the International Institute so that other families may be able to use them and your used clothing will be appreciated.

On Tuesday, the four oldest children started school. Their parents are very excited as education is important to them. There was a problem with the bus transportation but we drove the children to school and got them there on time. Hopefully, this will be resolved tomorrow.

On Wednesday, the plan is to take both parents to the House of Goods, a Muslim-run organization that assists Muslim families with home furnishings.

On Friday, one of the Family Partners will be taking the mother to the doctor for an ultrasound. We will have a better idea of the due date at that time.
